Re: Update on Drumnahough Wind Farm

Dear Householder,

I write to you on behalf of the team in SSE and FuturEnergy Ireland to provide you with an update on Drumnahough Wind Farm, to be located within the townlands of Treankeel, Meenadaura, Carrickalangan and Cark, adjacent to the existing Culliagh, Meentycat and Lenalea wind farms – see map for reference.

Drumnahough Wind Farm is a consented 58MW, 12-turbine wind farm that is being co-developed by SSE Renewables and FuturEnergy Ireland. The wind farm was granted planning permission by An Bord Pleanála (now An Coimisiún Pleanála) in September 2022 following a period of local engagement and consultation throughout 2019 and 2020.

Working with our project partners in FuturEnergy Ireland, we are now happy to announce the **start of pre-construction works on Drumnahough Wind Farm, ahead of entering full construction in the coming weeks**. Two Public Information Events will be held in the coming weeks to enable the **local community and members of the local supply chain to meet the Project Team and find out more about the construction phase of the wind farm**.

Details of the Public Information Events are as follows:

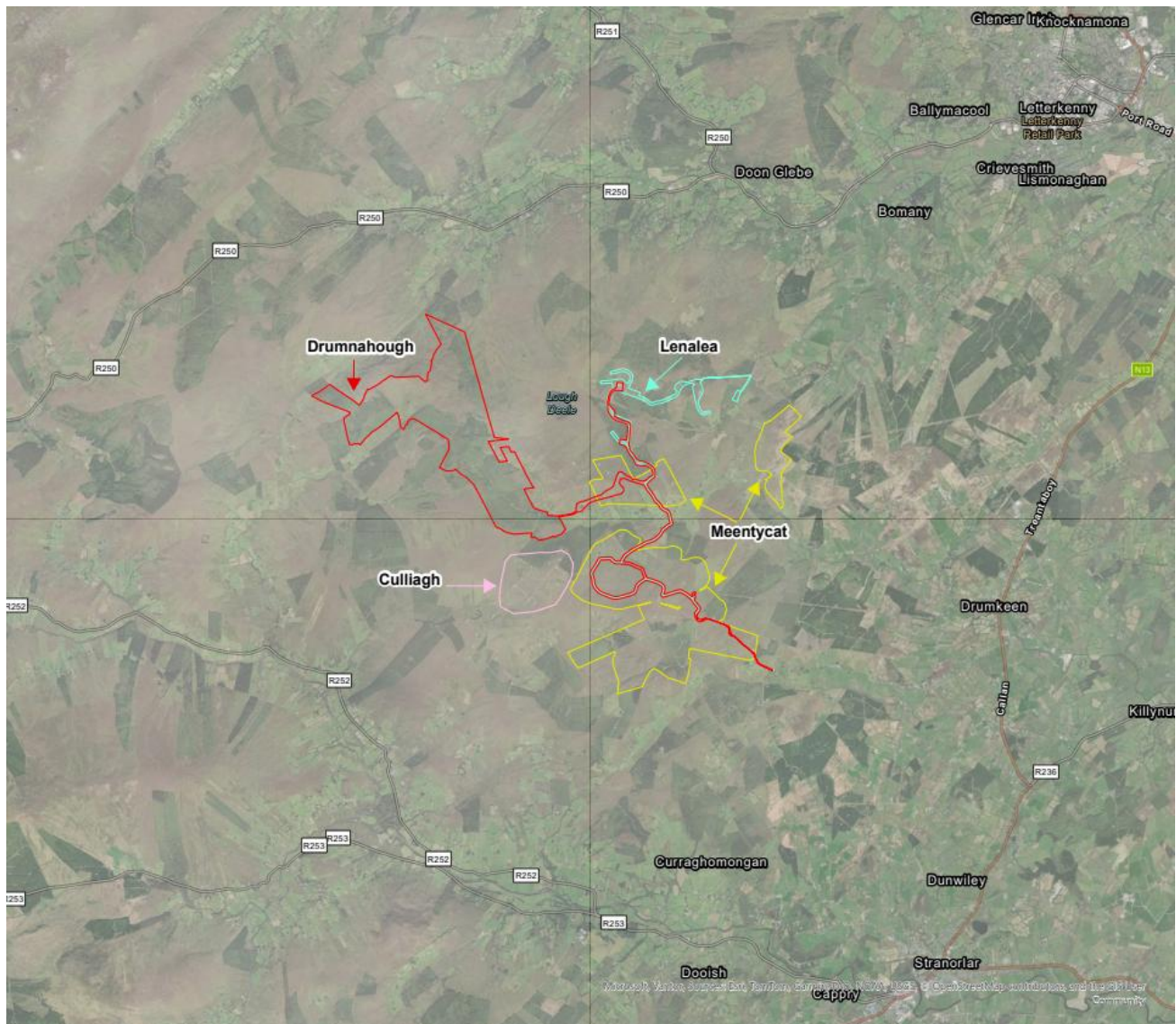
- Wednesday, December 10th in Jackson's Hotel, Ballybofey (F93 RD40), from 2:30pm-7:30pm, &
- Thursday, December 11th in Foxhall Community Hall, Newmills, Letterkenny (F92 KC98), from 2:30pm-7:30pm.

The construction of Drumahough Wind Farm represents a significant investment in the local economy and will create approximately 60 jobs at peak project delivery, representing a shared capital investment of around €120 million by SSE and FuturEnergy Ireland. Once operational, Drumnahough will also bring Ireland another step closer to meeting its 2030 renewables and decarbonisation targets and to assisting Ireland's energy security goals.

Drumnahough will also support a significant community benefit fund. The fund will be designed in consultation with the local community and will help fund community projects in the area around the wind farm.

Drumnahough Wind Farm is the latest investment in Donegal from SSE and FuturEnergy Ireland. Lenalea Wind Farm, also co-developed with FuturEnergy Ireland, became operational in late 2023, while SSE Renewables already operates the Culliagh and Meentycat wind farms. Together, these wind farms sustain local employment, contribute to the local economy via community benefit funding and commercial rates payments to Donegal County Council.
